Dear Parent / Carer

End of Term Arrangements

I hope this finds you well as we approach the final few days in school before the Christmas break. I am writing to confirm some end-of-term arrangements as well as key dates for the new year.

Attendance remains our top priority in school and we encourage all students to attend every day in the week ahead. Our '100 Club' draw takes place on Thursday so please remind your child to place their tickets in the boxes near the dining hall before Thursday morning and remind them, always, that they need to be in to win! Research from the Department for Education makes clear that students whose attendance is over 95% have the best chance of securing the best grades in GCSEs and getting firm foundations during Key Stage Three is vital to achieve success at Key Stage Four.

Our Year 11 students have completed their mock exams and enjoyed their results assembly this week - with only 16 (school) weeks to go until the first exam, there has never been a better time to make revision part of the daily and weekly routine. Our Year 10 students have completed their first Key Stage Four assessments and reports will be distributed soon. Our Key Stage Three students are the next cohort in school to be tested and your child has details of their Endpoints assessments slots. Please encourage your child to revise for these assessments as they allow staff to celebrate success and to consider areas for improvement.

We have been very proud of our students as they have got to grips with SPARX homework over the last term. As you are aware, this homework is set weekly on a Wednesday at 3pm and closes on the following Wednesday at 8am. We strongly encourage every student to complete these (and all!!) pieces of homework - we know that students who complete SPARX revision and homework every week have a far greater chance of achieving higher grades at GCSE and regular revision makes a huge difference to students at all levels. We reward completion with stamps which can be 'cashed in' for queue jump tickets at lunchtime, home bakes, tuck shop vouchers and more, as well as special treats from our maths and science departments. Many students will receive a reward this week. We strongly encourage completion of SPARX tasks and would like to thank you for your support.

In line with other schools across the Heartwood Learning Trust, we have introduced our YONDR pouches this half term as we have sought to become a truly phone-free school and the impact on our young people is clear. I would ask for your continued support in ensuring that your child brings a bag and their pouch to school every day so we can operate this system effectively.

If you believe your child is eligible and you have not yet received your voucher, or you have misplaced it, please contact the school office before the end of term.
